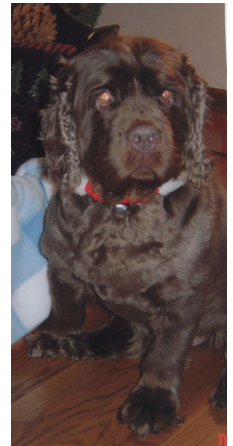

Canine Heartworm Disease

Heartworms are parasites that are transmitted by mosquitoes. When an infected mosquito bites your dog, your dog then becomes infected with heartworms. Heartworms can live in the heart, lungs, and throughout the bloodstream. Heartworms can be treated in dogs, but it is a very expensive treatment. Without treatment, heartworm disease is fatal. There are once a month preventatives available for your dog. Preventatives are very inexpensive especially compared to the price of treatment. All dogs need to be tested for heartworm disease before heartworm prevention can be given. The preventatives are very safe and effective when used properly. Your dog needs to be kept on a once a month preventative all year round to work properly. Indiana is the tenth worst state in the country for heartworm disease. Keeping your pet indoors 100% of the time does not give 100% protection against heartworms. All dogs are at risk for heartworm disease. If you keep your dog on a once a month preventative purchased from a licensed veterinarian and have a heartworm test performed on your dog once a year, the company that makes the product will give you a 100% guarantee. So if you follow the guidelines and your dog ever becomes positive for heartworms, the company will pay for the treatment.

New Porphyromonas Vaccine

We have a new vaccine available for dogs. It is called Porphyromonas. This vaccine aids in the prevention of canine periodontitis. Periodontitis is the most common bacterial infection in dogs and causes tooth loss. Porphyromonas fights the bacteria that attacks the roots of the teeth. It helps to keep the roots of the teeth healthy to prevent tooth decay. This vaccine does not stop the build up of plaque and tartar so it is still important to use a preventative and have dental cleanings done when needed. This vaccine will require a booster 4 weeks after the initial vaccine. This is a once a year vaccine after your dog has had the initial vaccine and the booster vaccine. We are lowering the price of the vaccine temporarily to help everyone get their dogs started on Porphyromonas. Porphyromonas is recommended for all breeds, all sizes, and all ages.
