Feline Heartworm Disease

Just like dogs, cats can become infected with heartworms. Heartworm disease is transmitted by a mosquito bite. Once an infected mosquito bites your cat, the cat then becomes infected with heartworms. Heartworms can live in your cat's heart, lungs, and throughout the bloodstream. Clinical signs vary in cats. Some cats do not show any signs of heartworm disease while other cats may vomit, cough, and/or have trouble breathing. Unfortunately there are no cures for feline heartworm disease. Although there are no cures, there are several products available through your veterinarian to prevent heartworm disease. The preventives are given once a month and if used properly are guaranteed. All breeds, sizes, and ages, whether they are indoor or outdoor cats, should be on a once a month preventative. Cats that stay inside 100% of the time are not 100% protected from heartworm disease without using a preventative. Give us a call to discuss which preventative is right for your cat.

Shelbyville Road Veterinary Hospital offers boarding for your pets. We only board for our patients. We like to have a relationship with the animals so we can provide better care. All dogs must be current on DHLPPC, Bordetella, and Rabies. Furthermore, dogs must have a heartworm test and fecal test done within the past year. Dogs must be current on both heartworm prevention and flea prevention that has been purchased from a licensed veterinarian's office. All cats must be current on all vaccines, including FVRCP, Feline Leukemia, Feline Bordetella, and Rabies. Cats must also have a fecal test done within the past year. They must also be current on heartworm prevention and flea prevention purchased from a licensed veterinarian's office. Stop by today to take a tour of our boarding facilities.
